John R. "Jack" Lewis (3/25/1936–9/8/2021)

Jack served on the Board for more than 10 years, served as President from 2014–2016, and was an active FOLKS volunteer for over 15 years. He served as a Lake Sweep Captain for the northern part of the lake and was key to starting the FOLKS Adopt-an-Island program which still is going strong today. Jack was a strong and supportive



voice for FOLKS. He was a constant contributor for *The Sentinel*, our bimonthly newsletter that focuses on Lake Keowee initiatives to keep the Lake clean and pristine for all to enjoy. He also did a great job presenting our achievements to homeowner associations around the lake to increase our membership. Jack was a strong leader of FOLKS and his commitment and passion for preserving Lake Keowee cannot be understated.
